

Curated and hosted by the Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival, their <u>Neighbourhood</u> <u>Map</u> features more than 2,689 cherry blossom tree locations. Sortable by cultivar, bloom period, and neighbourhood, you can readily locate exactly what you want and where you'll need to go.

To expand the intel of the map, the VCBF also has <u>a webpage featuring what's in bloom</u>, by neighbourhood. For example, in early April you will be seeing Beni-shidare, Accolade, Somei-yoshino, Akebono, Afterglow, and Pandora cultivars of cherry blossoms. If you've been to David Lam Park this week, those are Afterglow that are in beautiful bloom.

There are 54 cultivars of cherry trees in Vancouver; they bloom in waves, starting in mid-March, and ending with a third wave that runs around the last 10 days of April. That's when the VCBF's Sakura Night Gala takes place, amidst the beautiful blooms around the Stanley Park Pavilion.
