But don't be sad – remember that part of the beauty of the blossoms is in their ephemeral nature! The Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival organizers have arranged for a barge, adorned with almost 40 flowering cherry trees, to make it's way around the city to celebrate the last day of the tenth anniversary of the festival. The Blossom Barge departs Crab Park in the DTES at 8:30am this Saturday and slowly parades its fluffy pink self past Canada Place, Stanley Park, English Bay, Granville Island, and Science World, and then back to Granville Island Market where it will dock and act as the base for a mini-festival of free performances. Festivities continue Sunday until 5pm when the barge will pack up and sail away until next season.
