The Blossom Barge departs Crab Park in the Downtown Eastside at 8:30 a.m. Saturday and slowly parades its fluffy pink self past Canada Place, Stanley Park, English Bay, Granville Island and Science World, and then back to Granville Island Market, where it will dock and act as the base for a mini festival of free performances. Festivities continue on Sunday until 5 p.m., when the barge will pack up and sail away.
